Entry Rules & Regulations:



1. This show is sponsored by the Alberta Junior Limousin Association (AJLA) and is open to all Canadian Junior Limousin Association members. Members who are under 22 years old before January 1, 2009 are eligible to show.

2. Age Divisions

- A) Peewee - 8 years and younger** as of January 1st of the competition year.
- B) Junior - 9 - 12 years** as of January 1st of the competition year.
- C) Intermediate - 13 - 16 years** as of January 1st of the competition year.
- D) Senior - 17 - 21 years** as of January 1st of the competition year.

3. Registration & Fees

ENTRY DEADLINE IS JUNE 10, 2009 - ALL entry fees are NON-REFUNDABLE!!!

- In all classes where certificate of registration is required, the same or an application for, must be produced at the time of entry. Calves **MUST** be tattooed and preferably registered.
- Animals registered jointly by two juniors may only be exhibited by one. If an animal is jointly owned by a junior and a non-junior, it must be shown in the Open Division.
- Tattoos will be checked, on the purebred cattle, by the person in charge and they will have the authority to remove exhibits from the show if the tattoo on the animal does not correspond with the one stated on the registration papers. Purebred calves born in the calendar year must be properly tattooed.
- Each exhibit may only be entered in one conformation class.
- Calves may be shown with their dams or individually. In the event that both would qualify to advance only one animal unit can advance.
- Age of animals is based on January 1st of the competition year.
- All 2 Year Old Females and Mature Females entered in the conformation classes must be accompanied by their natural calendar year calf(s).
- Embryo Transfer (ET) calves cannot be shown with their donor mothers.
- Recipient cows can not be shown with ET calves.

Divisions - Classes: An animal may only be entered in ONE division, however you may enter as many animals as you like.

Commercial Division: Animals must be at least 50% Limousin and show Limousin characteristics. Animals may be disqualified if they do not meet these requirements. This will be left to the discretion of the show committee. Animals do not qualify for the overall Champion Class, they will have their own Champion Class.

- Commercial Division - Class 100 - Heifer Calf
- Class 101 - Yearling Heifer
- Class 102 - Two Year Old Cow/Calf
- Class 103 - Mature Cow/Calf

Steer Division: Steers must be half blood or higher percentage to compete and sired by a registered Limousin bull or out of a registered pure-bred Limousin cow.

Prospect Steer Division - Class 200 - Prospect Steer - calendar year calf

Open Division - Female: Cattle entered in the Open Division may show anyone as the registered owner, but may only be the exhibit of one junior. Animals DO NOT show in the Overall Champion class. they will have their own Champion Class.

Open Division - Bull: Cattle entered in the Open Division may show anyone as the registered owner, but may only be the exhibit of one junior. Animals DO NOT show in the Overall Champion class. they will have their own Champion Class.

4-H Division: Cattle entered in the 4-H Division must be a purebred registered 4-H animal. 4-H registered to the junior member. Please provide proof, heifer with 4-H tag, a signed document form your 4-H leader, 4-H book.

 - Class 501 - Two Year Old Cow/Calf
 - Class 502 - Mature Cow/Calf

Junior Division: Purebred animals whose registered owner is the junior member.

 - Class 602 - Two Year Old Cow/Calf
 - Class 603 - Mature Cow/Calf

Bred & Owned Division: Animals for which the junior member is the registered breeder as well as the registered owner.

- Class 700 - Bull Calf
 - Class 701 - Yearling Bull

Champion Bred & Owned Bull

- Bred & Owned Female Division
- Class 800 - Heifer Calf
 - Class 801 - Yearling Heifer
 - Class 802 - Two Year Old Cow/Calf
 - Class 803 - Mature Cow/Calf

Overall Champion & Reserve Champion Female - Overall Champions picked from 4-H Division, Junior Division & Bred & Owned Division

General Rules & Regulations:



- A)** Any exhibitor making entry, by doing so agrees to the rules and regulations of the government of the exhibition.
- B)** Any exhibitor shall, if required by the Directors make a statutory declaration that the exhibit made by him/her are shown with the Rules and Regulations of the committee. In case any exhibitor refuses to make such a declaration on being requested, all premiums awarded him/her shall be forfeited.
- C)** The production of any animals may be ordered by the Committee in charge for viewing or other purposes at any time during the exhibition, and any attendant refusing or neglecting to bring such animals out as directed shall forfeit his/her entry and any premiums that may have been awarded to him/her.
- D) ADULTS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO PREPARE OR ASSIST WITH THE PREPARATION OF ANIMALS.** Juniors are encouraged to assist other juniors with these preparations. **Violations will result in immediate dismissal from the competition or event.**
- E)** All yearling bulls **MUST** have a nose ring.
- F)** No artificial fitting of animals will be allowed unless under the advise of a licensed, nonowner, veterinarian. All animals doctored in any way artificially or improperly, or unfairly prepared or tampered with before coming into the show ring will be disqualified. Violation will result in immediate review by the Hearing Committee.
- G)** Upon discovery of fraud, deception, or dishonest practise, either in the preparation, ownership, or any representation concerning the exhibits which may have been intended to affect or affected the decision of the judges, the committee has the power to withhold the award and may prohibit any such party or parties form exhibition in any case for one or more years, and may also publish the names of such persons, if deemed expedient.
- H)** All cattle must adhere to Regional Health Regulations.
- I)** All animals will be subject to veterinary inspection.
- J)** All stall doors must be left open so that visitors may inspect the livestock between the hours of 7:00 am and 8:30 pm. All stalls must be cleaned out before 7:00 am so that refuse can be removed.
- K)** No person shall be permitted to the cattle ring during the time of judging except the judge or assistants, person(s) in charge of animals, committee members and members of the press.
- L)** Any person who shall attempt to interfere with or influence the judges while in the discharge of their duties, or who shall on the premises of the Exhibition use contemptuous or abusive language to a judge, in the consequences of the awards made by him/her, shall forfeit his/her right to all premiums which he/she might otherwise be entitled to, and shall be excluded from exhibition next year. Judges are particulary requested to report any breach of this rule.
- M)** Judges in making awards are to confine themselves to the classes in the prize list.

Protests: Any exhibitor lodging a protest must make it in writing to the Committee before 8:00 am the next day following the cause of the protest. It must plainly state the cause of the complaint or appeal, and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$5.00 which sum shall be forfeited if the said person is not sustained.

Miscellaneous:

- Though the committee will take every precaution to ensure the safety of the cattle sent to the show, they wish it distinctly understood that the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting them and that if any animal is injured, lost, or stolen, the committee will not make payment for the value thereof.

- Any animal whilest on the premises for exhibition, or any other purpose, shall be on such premises entirely at the risk of the owner thereof, and the committee will not be liable for damage which may be claimed by reason of any accident or injury to such animals, in any case whatsoever.

- Exhibitors of animals liable to occasion accidents, injury or damage to persons coming in contact therewith, shall indemnify the committee from the against all claims and demands, cost, charges, and expenses which may incur, suffer, or be put to, by any reason of accidents or of any person being injured or suffering damage through or by any reason of such exhibits not being properly guarded, or the public not being properly protected from the same.

- The committee will not be responsible for any injury to person or property of anyone, notwithstanding that the injury may occur on the property during the show whether or not such injury shall have been caused by negligence of the committee, or any other person.

Grand Aggregate:

- Points will be awarded for conformation (if entered in more that one class, your best placing will be used)
- Points will be awarded in each competition and the individual that attains the most points in each category will be declared the winner.

- We will base aggregate points on the top placings of **six (6) competitions.**

Competitions:

Team Grooming:

- Teams of three (3) participants will be made up by the show committee.
- Chutes will be supplied, but participants must bring an animal.
- Compete in a 20 minute grooming competition.
- Animal must be washed and dried before the grooming competition.
- Clippers, blowers and any necessary show supplies may be used.
- Once at chute area you are not allowed to leave so bring all equipment with you.
- No compulsory dress code.

Print Marketing:

- This competition requires the participant to create an Limousin related advertisement by using materials provided at the conference, during the allotted time.
- Outside material and previously prepared advertisements will be disqualified.
- All supplies will be provided

Show Team Judging:

- The teams are expected to judge a class of cattle in a show ring setting.
- Teams of two (2) participants preferably from the same age category.
- If you don't have a partner one will be assigned.
- Dress - Western Formal
- One of the team members will act as the ring person and the other will act as the judge.
- The participant acting as the judge must give oral reasons over the microphone in front of an audience.
- All other teams must be out of the judging area and unable to hear reasons being given by the other teams until they have completed their competition.



Photography - Best Limo Shot:

- The photograph must be taken by the participant exhibiting it.
- Photographs must be no smaller than 4"x 6" and no larger than 8"x10".
- Photographs must not be framed.
- Photographs must be handed in at registration.
- Only one photo per participant allowed.
- Put your show number on the back of your photograph for identification.
- Your photo may be kept for promotional purposes.

Oral Marketing:

- This contest evaluates an actual sales talk given to a potential buyer (the judge) by the contestant (you).
- Materials allowed: Photo of cow/heifer, Photo of Dam, Sire, Service Sire of cow/heifer, registration paper and business card.
- Contestants will be judged on their knowledge of the animal they are selling, their ability to relate important information, organization and style, poise and delivery.
- The judge will do a presentation on the premises before you start.

Showmanship:

- Showmanship classes will be held separately from conformation.
- Animals will be made available for participants not exhibiting animals.
- If the participant has his/her own animal, it must be used in the competition.
- Cows may be shown without calves at side.
- Participants must have appropriate show attire of choice.
- Competition will start with Senior division and work down.

Industry Quiz:

- The Quiz will consist of Agriculture, Livestock and Breed knowledge questions.
- A maximum of 1 hour will be allowed.
- Contestants may not bring notes, books, or reference materials into the testing area. All necessary materials will be provided.
- Conferring with other contestants, use of notes or any other form of cheating will be grounds for disqualification of a contestant.
