2026 Canadian Junior Limousin Impact Show – Competitions

The Canadian Junior Limousin Impact Show 2026 is open to Canadian Junior Limousin members. Competition and activities will be available for exhibitors in Little Ones, Peewee, Junior, Intermediate and Senior Divisions as follows:

Little Ones: 5 and under as of January 1, 2026

Peewee: 6-8 years as of January 1, 2026

Junior: 9-12 years as of January 1, 2026

Intermediate: 13-16 as of January 1, 2026

Senior: 17-21 as of January 1, 2026

If you are not a Canadian Junior Limousin Association (CJLA) Member please register by filling out the New Member application or contact the CLA office.

Little Ones

The following competitions are available for the Little Ones Division:

Showmanship Competition

- 2026 Impact show shirts provided at registration are to be worn for both the showmanship and conformation show
- Each entrant must use the same animal for all phases of the showmanship competition.
- Little Ones are required to have another junior or a parent accompany them in the ring.
- Peewee division participants may have someone accompany them in the ring, ideally another participant.

Conformation Show

- 2026 Impact show shirts provided at registration are to be worn for the showmanship and conformation competitions.
- Fitting is allowed, if completed by the **EXHIBITORS ONLY**
- An animal may only be entered in one division.
- One entry per division, per exhibitor
- Classes may be split, at the discretion of the show committee.
- Calves will be allowed to be split off the cow and shown in their own class

Progress Market Animal Show

- 100 -Progress Market Show - 2025 Born Purebred, Percentage or Influenced Steer or Market Heifer with an estimated harvest date in fall of 2026. Class will be split on weight if class numbers are too large.

Grand Champion Limousin and Reserve Champion Market Animal

Percentage Limousin & Commercial (Limousin Influence) Show

This is for any animals with Limousin percentage papers, or Lim-Flex papers recognized by the Canadian Limousin Association, or Limousin influenced cattle that do not have registration papers from the Canadian Limousin Association.

102- Junior Yearling Heifer born April 1 – December 31, 2025

103- Senior Yearling Heifer born January 1 – March 31, 2025

Grand Champion Limousin Influenced Female and Reserve Champion Female

Purebred Open Show

The Purebred Open Show is for purebred Limousin cattle. Cattle may be owned by the junior member, the junior member's family, registered as a 4-H project, or it may be a borrowed animal. Cattle must be registered with the Canadian Limousin Association and have a registration certificate prior to the show date. Cattle with an unregistered number on show day will be moved to the Limousin Influence class.

104- Bull calf born in 2026 [In memory of Brian Lee](#)

For the 2026 Impact Show, the Purebred Bull Calf Class is sponsored in memory of Brian Lee. Brian was a strong supporter of our junior program and dedicated to raising Limousin bulls. In Brian's memory, there will be \$1500 in added prize money for this class sponsored by Hollee Limousin.

Bred & Owned Cattle

All Bred & Owned cattle will be shown in the Registered Open Show. Highest placing Bred & Owned cattle in the purebred show will be recognized and awarded. No aggregate points will be awarded for Bred & Owned cattle.

Bred & Owned must be registered in the junior member's name. Bred & Owned will be confirmed based on CLA registry status by the show committee. No entry required.

- Purebred Bull calf born in 2026
- Heifer calf born in 2026
- Junior Yearling Heifer born April 1 – December 31, 2025
- Senior Yearling Heifer born January 1 – March 31, 2025
- Two-year old cow (2024) with 2026 natural calf at foot
- Mature cow with 2026 natural calf at foot

100K Jackpot Show- Genotype/Phenotype Judging

We are excited to again offer the 100K Jackpot Show. Classes are open to both heifer calves and yearling females. All entries must have a DNA test (30K or 100K) completed through the CLA. Samples must be submitted to the lab by June 15th, 2026. We cannot guarantee DNA results will be returned in time to be accepted after that deadline.

Each Junior is permitted one entry in each of the heifer calf division and the yearling division. Placings in the jackpot divisions will not count towards any aggregate points.

Classes will be judged on EPDs prior to the showing of the animals. EPD placings will be weighted at 50% of the final score and placings in the ring for conformation will account for the remaining 50% of the final score. EPDs will be evaluated based on the following: Must have above breed average EPD for weaning weight, milk and docility and below average for birth weight.

Classes may be split dependent on the number of entries and will be at the show committee's discretion.

Classes will be blow and go for all exhibitors. Please wear your Impact Show shirt provided.

Entry for 2026 is \$40/animal

- Heifer Calf born in 2026 - Purebred, Percentage, Lim-Flex
- Yearling Heifer born in 2025 - Purebred, Percentage, Lim-Flex

Team Grooming

Teams will compete to properly prepare and fit one animal for the showring. Teams of four participants (with one member from each age division) will be made up by the show committee and posted prior to the competition.

- Teams will be given a time limit in which to prepare their animal.
- Chutes will be supplied
- Animals must be washed and dried before the competition begins.
- Clippers, blowers and any necessary show supplies may be used and must be supplied by the participants.
- After animal preparation is complete, animals will be presented to the judges for inspection.
- Once at the chute area, participants are not allowed to leave, so it will be important to plan ahead with your team.
- Clipping pants/wind pants may be worn by the group members during animal preparation. One of the group members will present the animal and must be dressed in show clothing and footwear to present the animal.

Scoring:

30% Participation

40% Teamwork

30% Skill and ability to prepare an animal for the show ring

Show Team Judging

New this year we are introducing individual judging. Much the same as team judging teams of two will go in the ring to judge either females or bull calves. However this year EVERYONE will be a Judge. Scores will be tallied entirely based off the judge. Ringmen will not get a score. The judge will give reasons to a section of bleachers where the two scorers will be sitting.

- Judges will be partnered with a ringman that day at random
- Reasons to a Section of bleachers (not over a microphone)
- Scores based solely on Judge not the ringman
- 7 Minute time limit 5 min to look at animals 2 minutes for reasons
- 3 rings will run simultaneously (JR, INT, SR) a larger age group may turn into two rings as another age groups finish

Industry Quiz

- Questions will be made up of multiple choice, true/false questions, and fill in the blank.
- Juniors, Intermediates and Seniors will compete individually in a Kahoot Quiz pre-determined for each age division. **Each exhibitor will need access to a phone or tablet for the duration of the competition - there will be no sharing/teaming up for the competition.**
- Questions will be displayed on one central screen in the room. Participants will be given a code at the beginning of the game that allows them to participate. Each question will pop up upon prompting from an official. Participants will see the possible answers pop up on their personal device and can select the answer they wish. Scores will be based on correct response, as well as time to respond. After the timer has expired, the official will move on to the next question. Kahoot generates a score for each competitor which will be used to rank participant scores for the competition.
- Questions will be related to beef cattle and the Limousin breed and general questions about Canada
- Participants will be scored on both the correctness of their answer and their response times.
- Peewees will complete an identification quiz of various cattle-themed items. They will have to correctly identify them to a judge

Oral Marketing

- The purpose of this competition is to evaluate the effectiveness of the contestant's ability to present and market is trying to sell. Oral Marketing uses a live setting complete with animal or a photo (no larger than 8X10) and potential buyer
- Contestants may market a Limousin animal or genetics or a photo (no larger than 8X10) as the subject. Contestants may use a heifer/cow /bull other than their own. The contestant may hold or tie the animal or have another entrant hold the animal during the talk. The animal is not to be fitted.
- Immediately preceding the talk, contestants will be required to provide the judges with a copy of the registration certificate for the animal being "sold". The judges will use the registration certificate to evaluate the accuracy of pedigree and performance information provided by the contestant and to also ask questions. The certificate will be returned to the contestant at the conclusion of the talk. Original not required, copies may be used or accessed on line in Digital Beef.
- Materials allowed: Photo of cow/heifer/bull, Photo of Dam, Sire, Service Sire of cow/heifer/bull, registration paper and business cards.
- There is no limit on the length of the sales talk
- Dress is Western /Western formal attire

Scoring:

25% Knowledge of the animal they are selling

25% Ability to relate important information about the subject

25% Organization and style

25% Poise and delivery

Prepared Speech

Speeches will be done at home and submitted by email events@limousin.com deadline is August 14th, 2026

Topics and times are listed below by age category. Props, pictures or PowerPoints to accompany any speeches are welcome. Speeches must be written and delivered by the competing exhibitor. You can deliver a prepared speech and video yourself. You can also do a presentation using a Powerpoint or props. Your voice must be heard in the presentation.

Peeweeps: Write and present a 1-2 minute speech or presentation on: What is your favorite beef meal?

Juniors: Write and present a 2-3 minute speech or presentation on: The difference between commercial cattle and show cattle?

Intermediates: Write and present a 3-5 minute speech or presentation Why should commercial producers breed with Limousin Bulls?

Seniors: Write and present a 3-5 minute speech or presentation What is one problem in the Limousin breed and how can it be addressed?

Photography

Theme: **Agriculture or Cattle**

The photograph must be the original work of the exhibitor.

- Only one photo per participant is allowed.
- Images must be submitted by email to events@limousin.com **by August 14th, 2026.**
- Photos should be submitted as jpeg files.
- All photographs become the property of CJLA and may be used by CJLA or CLA for promotional purposes
- Please do not put your name on the front of photograph, it will be judged by contestant number

Print Marketing

- Competitors must design a one page full colour print ad that would be used in a magazine - everything must be done the day of the show
- **Theme: Market Limousin genetics to a commercial customers**
- This year Print Marketing will be done at the show using paper and materials provided - magazines, scissors etc.
- Exhibitors are welcome to bring their own craft supplies from home
- All work on the print ad must be done at the show- no cutting can be done ahead of time
- The image should fit on a printed 8 ½ x 11 page- paper will be provided
- All images become the property of CJLA and CLA

Artwork

Theme: Relates to agriculture or cattle

This is a broad topic for exhibitors to use their creativity. Art can relate to any part of showing livestock and the friendships you make along the way.

- Artwork must be designed and made by the exhibitor.
- All mediums may be used (paint, pencil, wood, metal etc.)
- **Artwork must be handed in at the show registration desk on August 26th.**
- **If you wish to keep your artwork, please inform the registration desk when you hand it in. Otherwise, it will be auctioned off at the banquet to raise funds for the show.**

Steak Cook-Off

The steak cook-off will be a fun group event. Teams will be selected by the organizing committee. Teams will have a captain that will be required to be in contact with all team members before the show. Teams will come up with a theme and costumes for their team. A list of supplied and non-supplied items will be provided. The day of the cook-off teams will get their steaks and boxes. Boxes will include the side everyone must prepare in their own way. And to add a twist each box will include a different mystery item. Desserts will be up to teams, they are not required nor will they be turned away. Everything will be cooked on a bar-b-que.

Spirit of the Impact Show Award In Loving Memory of Kylee Jade Stewart – Sponsored by Triple R Limousin, The Rodger's Family

The Spirit of the Impact Show Award will be given to competitors who display a willing and positive attitude at the Impact show. They work hard and do their best in the show ring and in the competitions. They are determined to do their best even while presented with challenges such as an animal misbehaving in the ring. The award is given to a Junior or Intermediate exhibitor.

The winners will be selected by the Rodgers family or by a designated individual to act on behalf of the family. The intent is that the award money is used to purchase livestock or livestock equipment.

CJLA Alumni Charity

This fun event is organized by the CJLA Board of Directors. The objective is to include CJLA alumni members in an annual event but also to give back to important things.

Every adult present is eligible, we encourage all past CJLA Alumni to participate. Entrants will compete in Showmanship and will be judged by the winners of the Show Team Judging Competition.

Each competitor will select a charity and will be competing in for that charity. Funds raised through registration will be split between the Impact Show and the Grand Champion Showpersons selected Charity.

Entries will be accepted until the time of the Alumni Show, however we encourage you to register ahead of time.

Cookies must be delivered by the announced deadline

This contest is not part of the aggregate competition.

The CJLA Impact Show Rules revised in 2016 are the foundation of the 2026 Impact Show

Eligibility

Participants in the National Conference are required to hold an individual CJLA membership.

Participants must be 21 years or younger as of January 1st of the competition year.

No participant will be discriminated against as a result of a physical, emotional or mental handicap. The only requirement is to specify on the entry form so accommodations can be made.

Health Requirements for Cattle

All cattle must meet the health requirements for the province where the event is held. Any questions regarding health requirements should be directed to your local or provincial veterinarian.

Individual Competition

Individual competition may consist of, but is not limited to, the following events: Industry Quiz, Judging Contest, Public Speaking, Conformation Show, Showmanship, Print Marketing, Oral Marketing, Photography, and Herdsman. Any new competition ideas must have a set of rules and approved by the CJLA Board of Directors and are at the discretion of the host province.

At all conferences the top 10 scores in each competition will receive points. The highest score will receive 10 points with each subsequent score receiving one less point, down to 1 point for the 10th score.

Contestants must compete in Team Judging, Industry Quiz, both Print and Oral Marketing and Showmanship at the scheduled competition time.

Team Competition

Team competition(s) may consist of, but are not limited to, the following events: Team Grooming, Quiz Bowl, Show Ring Judging, or Team Problem. Any competition must have a set of rules and be approved by the CJLA Board of Directors.

At all conferences the top 10 scores in each competition will receive points. The highest score will receive 10 points with each subsequent score receiving one less point, down to 1 point for the 10th score.

High Point/Aggregate Competition

High Point/Aggregate Competition

- a. The Aggregate competition will be determined by points won in all but the competitors' lowest score in the individual or group competitions.
- b. Conformation will not go towards aggregate points
- b. Points cannot be transferred to other competitors in any manner.
- d. No overall Aggregate prize will be available, only age division Grand and Reserve champion Aggregates.

Ties

Ties will be broken by comparing scores in the following events.

1st Tie-breaker = Oral Marketing

2nd Tie-breaker = Industry Quiz

3rd Tie-breaker = Team Judging

Peewee, Junior, Intermediate, and Senior division eligibility.

Peewee: 8 years and under as of January 1st of the competition year.

Junior: 9-12 years as of January 1st of the competition year.

Intermediate: 13-16 as of January 1st of the competition year.

Senior: 17-21 as of January 1st of the competition year.

Conduct, Hearing Committee and Disciplinary Action.

Conduct:

All competitors in attendance of Conferences are expected to conduct themselves with dignity and respect.

All competitors must abide by the on-site rules.

Violations include, but are not limited to: misrepresentation of animals, vandalism, theft, fighting, unsportsmanlike conduct, failure to comply with directors and officials, being in possession of or under the influence of alcohol or other prohibited substances while on the competition grounds and/or in public areas.

Violations of these standards will result in immediate review by the Hearing Committee.

Hearing Committee: Shall consist of attending representatives of the CJLA Board, CLA Board, and the CJLA advisor.

-An individual brought before the Hearing Committee may be accompanied by their parents or legal guardian.

-Failure of an individual to appear before the Hearing Committee when called will be considered cause for the committee to take disciplinary action against the individual.

- The committee, upon finding an individual in violation of the conduct rule, may take action as deemed necessary

Liability Provisions

- a. The host committee of the show is responsible to include in their entry forms, registration forms, information pages, and show catalogues, a Statement of Liability. The Statement, to be read as follows or in a similar context: *The CLA as well as the CJLA Provincial and National Committees and/or any of its employees and the Host Fairgrounds and/or any of its employees are not responsible for any accidents/thefts during the time prior to, during or after the conference*
- b. Age of animals is based on January 1st of the competition year.
- c. All entries in the Purebred/Fullblood classes must provide a CLA certificate of registration.
- d. Registered and Recorded cattle must have a legible tattoo which conforms to CLA records to be eligible. Tattoos may be inspected by show officials at time of arrival.
- e. All 2yr Old Females and Mature Females entered in the conformation classes must be accompanied by their natural calendar year calf(s).
- f. Embryo Transfer (ET) calves cannot be shown with their donor mothers.
- g. Recipient cows cannot be shown with ET calves.
- h. Rules will be published on the entry forms specific to each class.
- i. Only one entry per class per junior will be allowed.

No artificial filling of animals will be allowed unless under the advice of a licensed, non-owner, veterinarian. Violation will result in immediate review by the Hearing Committee.

All livestock entries must be stalled by the published move-in time on the published move-in date. Livestock release will not occur before the published time, unless approved by the show committee.

Ownership Rules

- a. The overall discretion of the host province determines ownership rules for their respective show, upon approval from the CJLA board, however the following are guidelines.
- b. All entries in the Bred & Owned division must be registered as such under the entrants' name.
- c. Commercial cattle entries must display Limousin characteristics or be accompanied by CLA percentage papers at the discretion of the host province show committee.
- d. Parent participation is strictly forbidden. Violations will result in immediate dismissal from the competition or event. Senior members are encouraged to assist the more junior members.

Entrants must be members of the CJLA.
Each entrant must use the same animal for all phases of the Showmanship Contest.
